Practical information

Objectives

The aim of the exchange is to bring together experts from the Crous and student service associations in Europe on a specific topic. For two days, these experts have the opportunity to share their experiences, promote joint expertise and learn about the work of colleagues in other countries who are working on the same topic.

Target groups

The exchanges are open to all experts in public student service organisations who are interested in the topic and who are associated to an ECStA member organisation. A mixed group of participants from two countries is planned for each exchange so that the hosts can also benefit from the experiences of the visitors.

<u>Costs</u>

Participants pay for their travel and hotel accommodation, while the host organisations provide lunch and - if possible - dinner.

Languages

The exchange will take place **in French** with a **consecutive translation into German**. An informal translation into English can only be provided upon individual request. Please contact the Cnous or the DSW in advance to ensure that everyone can follow the presentations. We will do our best to include everyone!

Registration

Participation is limited to a maximum of 35 people. Registrations will be processed in the order in which they are received. Several people from the same institution can only take part if there are enough places available.
