What is a cégep, anyway? It's an acronym from the French term Collège d'enseignement general et professionnel, which means General and professional teaching college. In the Canadian province of Québec, this is a public school that provides the first level of post-secondary education. All of the pre-university and technical programs leading to a Diplôme d'études collégiales (DEC or Diploma of College Studies), are recognized by a sanctioned diploma issued by the Ministry of Higher Education. Attestations of college studies (AEC) are issued by cégeps.
